

Journey Through the Parables: Adventure Log Book

We invite all who join us on this journey to make a book, “Journey Through the Parables: Adventure Log Book”, containing each of the Parables which they learn about. Every lesson will include a printable “log book” page for the book. Allow each child to complete this page and add it to a folder or binder. If you do this each week, by the end of the year, children will have interacted with every parable and will have a book to read and keep.

To create their personal log book, each child will need a fastener folder or a narrow binder. They may wish to decorate the cover all on their own. Or perhaps they will want to personalize and use one of the covers we have created (see below).

Each log book page will feature a printed copy of the parable of the week. There will be space provided for the child to write or draw about that parable. They will be invited to identify their favorite part of the parable or lesson. And at the bottom of the page, there will be a “secret message”, a related phrase to decode or unscramble.

Note: Very young children may find some parts of the log book page difficult to complete. If that is the case, they can skip the difficult parts, or complete them with some help. For example, perhaps children of various ages can work together, with older children spelling out or even writing the words on the younger ones' pages. Alternatively, parents/teachers could prepare the page for each younger child before the lesson, by adding dotted letters for the child to trace to fill in the title, for example. Or someone could write the words onto a narrow slip of paper (or on several narrow pieces of paper for the child to practice ordering their words) and then the young child can glue the piece(s) onto their log page. Solutions will vary by child, ability, and circumstances.
